2012 4x4 Trips

February

Dates: Friday 24th – Sunday 26th

Where to: Lesotho

The Route and places of interest: Quachas Nek, Sehlabathebe National Park (camp over), Matabeng Pass, Sehongong (camp over close by), Sani Pass.

Accommodation: Camping, self catering

Costs: R750 per adult. Costs include camping and guide fees.

MARCH

Dates: Friday 16th – Monday 18th

Where to: Mozambique, Stay over at Malongane.

The Route and places of interest: Kosi Border, Ponto Malongane, Maputo Elephant Reserve, Lake Piti, Ponto do Ouro.

Accommodation: Camping or Self Catering Chalets with the option of a restaurant.

Costs: R1600 per person. Costs include all camping costs and park entry fees. Chalet costs available on request

APRIL

Dates: Tuesday 18th – Monday 30th

Where to: Botswana

Route and places of interest: martins drift Border Post, Khama Rhino Sanctuary, Kubu Island (Magadigadi Pans), Maun, Xakanaxa (Moremi), Savuti (Chobe), Kasane, Elephant Sands (Nata).

Accommodation: Camping, self catering

Costs: R8000 per person. Children under 16 half price. Costs include all camping fees and park entry fees.

JUNE

Dates: Friday 15th – Monday 18th

Where to: Lesotho. 3 Nights at Semonkong Lodge

Route and Places of interest: Ficksburg, Thaba Bosiu, Roma, Ramabanta, Semonkong, Maletsunyane Water falls (102 meters, highest single drop falls in southern Africa. Fantastic 4x4 drive out's from the Lodge, pony Rides, hiking, Fly Fishing.

Accommodation: Comfortable Lodge accommodation with fires in each room. Self catering possible with a communal kitchen, but the lodge has excellent bar and restaurant facilities.

Costs: R2100 per person sharing excluding meals.

Any vehicle, no matter the make, may give some form of trouble or other during the course of its lifetime, and all too often, just after

being serviced.

Part of your trip planning should include having your vehicle serviced at least 2 weeks prior to your departure date, giving you time to put on a bit of mileage before you leave.

The same goes for your Trailer or Caravan, and if the wheel bearings have not been replaced in a while, there is no time like the present. Ask for the old bearings back so that you now have a set of spares, and who knows who you may one day be able to help out when they are stuck on the side of the track.

If you have not test driven one yet, do so now, it's a real pleasure driving one of these vehicles. At around 200kw for a small bodied vehicle, the auto box moves it along quite nicely with good acceleration and a comfortable cruising speed obtainable. The **FJ** is a part time 4 wheel drive being able to shift in and out of 4x4 mode as often as one likes and at virtually any speed that one likes. The vehicle is extremely capable off-road and is quite at home in the worst of conditions, just what one would expect from a Cruiser I suppose.



The overall quality of the vehicle is of an extremely high standard, and running with an already proven drive train.

That's all for now folks, with the "Silly Season" rushing towards us like an FJ in high ratio going full speed down the side of a dusty Gauteng mine dump, take care and drive safely wherever the season takes you. If you're going off-roading this season, keep it Green.
